Make a Plan to Vote at Your Polling Place



- 1. Check your Voter Registration Status: Go to the <u>PA Dept. of State</u> website to verify that you are registered to vote. You will also find your address, your political party (if chosen), and your polling place where you will cast your vote. Your Voter Registration Card will also have this information. (Your County Elections Office can replace your card.)
- 2. Decide if you need ID: Acceptable IDs for the first time you vote or the first time in a polling place are below. Otherwise, ID is not required in Pennsylvania unless your identity is challenged.
- **3.** Make sure you can **find your polling place** and figure out how to travel there.
- **4. Decide what time of day you will go to vote** and **make necessary arrangements** ahead of time.
- **5.** At your polling place, you will check in with an election official.
- 6. Carefully look over your PAPER BALLOT, before making your choices. Made an error? Ask for a new ballot—Do not cross out or erase items. (You may also request a ballot-marking device.)
- 7. Make sure your ballot is complete. Insert your ballot in the machine that scans it. Do not leave until you see "Thank you for voting!". You will have successfully cast your ballot.
