DEADLINES for Mail-in Voting

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MAIL-IN and ABSENTEE Voting Dates and Deadlines

- **APPLY NOW!**
The APPLICATION Process is Open
- **OCTOBER 26, 2021 at 5:00 PM:**
Deadline to APPLY for a Mail-in or Absentee Ballot
- **NOVEMBER 2, 2021 at 8:00 PM:**
Deadline to COMPLETE and RETURN a Mail-in or Absentee Ballot

IMPORTANT Mail-In and Absentee Voting DATES and DEADLINES:

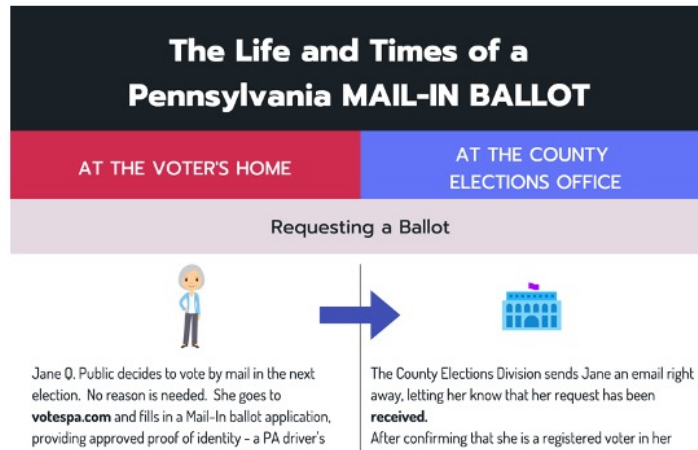
*The Mail-in Ballot and Absentee Ballot are the same. “No-excuse” Mail-in voting in Pennsylvania does **not require a reason** for voting by mail. Anyone may apply for a “No-excuse” Mail-in Ballot. Absentee voting **does require** specific, approved reasons for absence from a polling place and voting with a Mail-in Ballot.*

Apply NOW! The APPLICATION Process is Open.

You may apply online, or on paper.

- **APPLY by OCTOBER 26, 2021, at 5:00 PM:** Your completed Mail-in Ballot APPLICATION must be RECEIVED by your [County Election Office](#) by this date.
(The postmark is not enough.)
- **BALLOTS** will be sent once candidates and ballot initiatives are finalized and ballots are printed.
- **RECEIVED by NOVEMBER 2, 2021, at 8:00 PM:** Your completed Mail-in BALLOT must be RETURNED and RECEIVED by your [County Election Office](#) by this date.
(The postmark is not enough.)

UNDERSTANDING the MAIL-IN Ballot Process

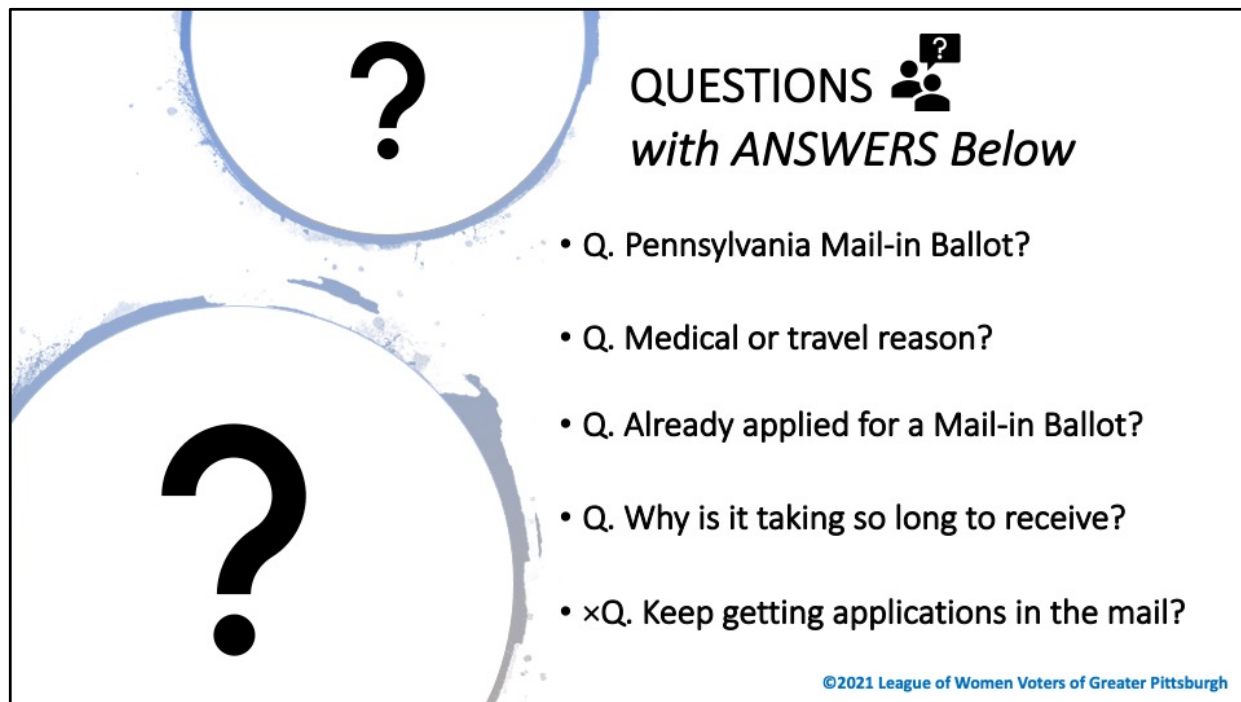

Q. Who can apply for a Pennsylvania Mail-in Ballot?

A. Anyone who is registered to vote in Pennsylvania may apply for a Mail-in Ballot.

Q. Do I need a medical or travel reason to use a Mail-in Ballot?

A. No. **No excuse is needed.** You may vote using a Mail-in Ballot simply because you prefer to.

Q. Why does the online application ask me about my reason for requesting a Mail-in Ballot if I don't need a reason?

A. The Pennsylvania Constitution requires that an absentee ballot be provided in case of illness or absence from the district. Until the PA Constitution is amended, the separate absentee category and its qualifying questions has to remain. In the meantime, **just answer "no" to the qualifying questions, and you will continue to the mail-in application.**

Q. I can't remember if I already applied for a Mail-in Ballot. What happens if I apply more than once?

A. If you apply for a Mail-in Ballot twice, your second application will be denied because it is a duplicate. **There is no penalty for applying twice.**

Q. My Ballot request was approved weeks ago, but I still haven't received my Ballot. Why is it taking so long?

A. Ballots are not printed until about a month before Election Day. This is because candidates have to qualify for the ballot by filing official paperwork and petitions. After deadlines and legal challenges are resolved, the County Elections Office can finalize candidates--then Ballots will be printed and mailed.

Q. I already applied for a Ballot, but I keep getting applications in the mail. Does this mean that my first application was rejected?

A. **No. Many outside groups send Mail-in Ballot applications to voters.** These groups include political candidates and parties and other groups. The County Elections Office does not send or control this mail, and these outside groups do not know whether you have already applied. **If you do not want the application, just throw it out.**

MAIL-IN BALLOT: PA Act 77, 2019 allowed any registered voter to apply for a Mail-in Ballot. Voters may simply request the ballot WITHOUT A REASON .	ABSENTEE BALLOT: Before PA Act 77, 2019, this was the only way to vote if you were going to be “absent” from your polling place on Election Day for an approved reason.
DEADLINE: But Do This NOW--Don't Wait! ONLINE MAIL-IN BALLOT Applications must be RECEIVED by your County Elections Office by 5 pm on May 11, 2021 .	DEADLINE: But Do This NOW--Don't Wait! PAPER MAIL-IN BALLOT Applications must be RECEIVED by your County Elections Office by 5 pm on May 11, 2021 .
GO to VotesPA.com. Choose “Mail-in and Absentee Ballots”. Scroll down and click on OPTION 1: “Apply for a Mail-in Ballot ONLINE” .	GO to VotesPA.com. Choose “Mail-in and Absentee Ballots”. Scroll down and click on OPTION 2: “Apply for a Mail-in Ballot BY MAIL” .
Answer “NO” to the three questions and you will proceed with the ONLINE Mail-In Option. ONLINE ID: PA Driver's License or a PennDOT ID, or the last 4 digits of SSN with uploaded signature.	Can't download/print an application? Request ONLINE for an application to be MAILED to you or CALL 412-350-4500 . PAPER Form ID: PA Driver's License, PennDOT ID, or last 4 digits of SSN.
Carefully FOLLOW the DIRECTIONS to complete your ONLINE Application.	FOLLOW the DIRECTIONS to complete your PAPER Application: MAIL or TAKE your PAPER Application to: Allegheny County Elections Division, 542 Forbes Avenue, Suite 500, Pittsburgh, PA 15219 .
When you apply online, you may choose the option: ANNUAL Mail-in/Absentee Voter List. For a complete explanation, including the request form to cancel this option, click here .	To see a PRINTED application to apply for the ANNUAL option, you can download/print a Mail-in or Absentee Ballot application, apply ONLINE for an application to be MAILED to you, or CALL 412-350-4500 . For more, click here .
Provide your EMAIL ADDRESS and you can TRACK your Mail-in Ballot. You will receive a confirming email, after you SEND your ONLINE Application. When you apply for a Pennsylvania Mail-In Ballot, you can choose to make an "Annual Voting Request."

If you OPT IN, you will receive:

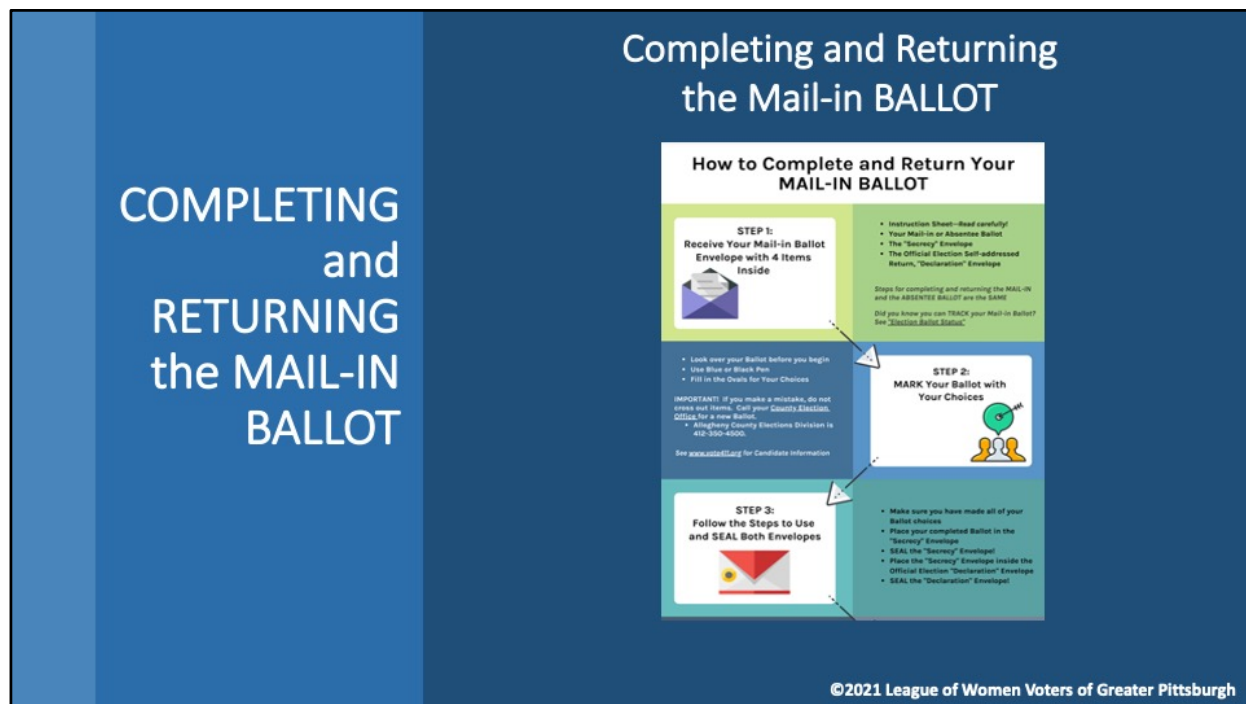
- **BALLOTS for each election in the coming year:** The May Primary, November General Election, and any Special Elections that may occur. You will not need to apply again *until next year*.
- **an APPLICATION in the mail every year in February**, so that you can apply for your annual ballots again. You will receive an application every February until you remove yourself from the Permanent list.
